Prescott Mountain Bike Alliance (PMBA) announces Bean Peaks Gravity Flow Trail System Fundraising Campaign

(Prescott, AZ, August, 2023) With official permission to build a Gravity Flow Trail system in the Bean Peaks area of the Prescott National Forest, the Prescott Mountain Bike Alliance (PMBA) kicked off its "Send it For Bean Peaks" fundraising campaign during a local event attended by more than 100 people at The Armory in Prescott's Historic District.

"I am confident that our community will rally and help raise the funds so we can start construction of the Bean Peaks Gravity Flow Trail system this fall," says Ximena Florez, Board President of PMBA. "We are thrilled to have received approval for the project, and we can't wait to start building."

The construction of this project will be broken down into three phases over three years. The first phase, budgeted at \$350,000, is scheduled for the fall of this year. PMBA has already raised \$180,000 and is looking to raise the remaining funds through upcoming outreach efforts and events.

<u>The Vivili Hospitality Group</u> is supporting the cause by hosting the "Send It for Bean Peaks: Come As You Are Gala" on September 16th at the County Seat. All proceeds -- from ticket sales and onsite activities -- will go to the <u>Bean Peaks Gravity Flow Trail System</u> project. Tickets are available <u>here</u>.
